

WHO WE ARE



AFM is the "Department of Associate Members" (Abteilung Fördernde Mitglieder) within FC St. Pauli 1910 e.V.

The AFM was founded in 1999, as a department where FC St. Pauli members are organised who are not actively participating in one of the numerous sports sections, or passively funding one of these.

The AFM wants to provide a home for all those fans who have professional and youth football of FC St. Pauli as well as the club and its fan culture at heart.

AFM members substantially fund and support youth football within our club. Thereby we create sustainable and forward-looking conditions for a comprehensive education of young and home grown professional footballers.

More than 75% of membership fees are fed directly into projects and schemes for youth development. In the past years, AFM members have managed to keep youth football inside our club constantly at a very high quality level, even during economically very difficult times.

Through the contributions of AFM members, lasting values are created for the FC St. Pauli. For example, the training

centre at Kollaustraße, the youth academy at Brummerskamp as well as the boarding home for young talents, and other projects related to socio-educational care of our young footballers have been fostered and funded by the AFM.

On top of that, numerous other sporting sections at the club are supported in their youth development.

Another important aspect of the AFM as a department is the provision of support to fan and club culture. In this context, AFM membership fees are funding the FC St. Pauli museum currently in the making, the "Fanräume" (Rooms for Fans) facilities within the Gegengerade building, the international AntiRa tournament and various other events fostering education or information on fan culture or wider political issues here at our Millerntor Stadium.

Inside the AFM, there is also a variety of projects in which club members can get involved directly themselves. Examples for successful activities run by volunteers for many years are the annual magazine "Young Rebels", the AFM Radio, the events for over 50 year olds, to name but a few. And we are always open for new ideas and input!

WHAT WE DO

Since its foundation, the AFM has initiated, funded and implemented various projects of youth development. The general goal is to turn the AFM membership fees into sustainable and long-lasting structures and values our club could not afford to establish otherwise.

Youth development projects - an overview

- Provision of comprehensive socio-educational care for youth players
- Acquisition, furnishing and maintenance of the boarding home for young players
- Equipment, upgrade and constant expansion of the Brummerskamp youth academy
- Establishment of a job training project for youth players
- The "Young Rebels" magazine as presentation platform for our youth teams
- Expansion of the vehicle fleet
- Provision of support with the implementation of training camps
- Funding of athletic and mental training
- Establishment of a scouting system and an electronic communication structure
- Expansion of the Kollaustraße training centre to integrate the Under 19 and Under 17 teams
- Furthermore, AFM also funds youth development in other sport sections of FC St. Pauli. We particularly focus on fostering girls' football, but also support the youth work within football for the visually impaired, handball, rugby, darts, bowling and various other sports.
